Subject: Report on the new manufacturing premises (Percussion
Fuse 1, Percussion Fuse 23 Pr.) of the firm KRUPP in
Wuestegiersdorf near Waldenburg i. Silesia.

By agreement with the Reich Minister for Armaments and War
Production, the factory in Auschwitz assigned to the firm KRUPP,
must be given to the firm U n i o n, in order to set up there the
machinery of the last named company from Saporoshe. KRUPP's, who
had suffered bomb damage, were asked to start looking immediately
for alternative factory premises, and were promised that machinery
and equipment for the manufacture of 200,000 percussion fuses
No. 1 would be put at their disposal before the end of the year.
The Main Munitions Committee undertook the responsibility of
furnishing the necessary workers.

KRUPP's had been allocated the former textile factory MEYER -

KAUFMANN, Wuestegiersdorf near Waldenburg i. Silesia, by the Office for Armaments II 4a, under No. 15985, of 10 August 1943.

The company will also receive today the order for removal from the WA Chef Ing. 7/VI. They will immediately inform the WA Chef Ing. 7/VI and the Ordnance Group

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of the despatch address so that the machinery can be immediately shipped there. Rue, Breslau is asked to give every support to KRUPP's and to give orders at the same time to Rue Kdo to do everything to accelerate the starting up of the factory so that the manufacture of the percussion fuse No. 1, which according to the order of the Fuehrer, is particularly needed at the present time, can be proceeded with immediately.

With reference to the telephone conference of today between WA J Rue (Mun 2), Colonel ZIMMERMANN and Assessor SCHULZE from the Reich Minister for Armaments and War Production, and Plenipotentiary General for the Removal of Plants, the O.K.H. requests that WA J Rue (Mun 2) be asked to see to it that the textile plant MEYER-KAUFMANN is closed down immediately, and the workers who thus become available be allocated to the fuse section.

Approximately 1000 workers will be needed for the manufacture

of the fuses. With regard to the billeting of workers who can not be supplied from the staff of the textile plant, the firm KRUPP will at once enter into negotiations with the Rue Kdo.
