Affidavit.

I, August Graefe, Geisenheim-Rheingau, Rheinstr. 5 am aware of the fact that I shall render myself liable to punishment by making a false affidavit. I declare on oath that my statement is true and was made in order to be submitted as evidence to the Military Tribunal in the Palace of Justice, Nuernberg.

The managements of the two firms, Fried. Krupp and Maschinenfabrik Johannisberg G.m.b.H. had no part in the administration of the camp for the 200 women-prisoners in Geisenheim who worked in the Works Department of Krupp and in the Maschinenfabrik Johannisberg G.m.b.H. The camp administration was conducted by the SS exclusively. The prisoners administered the affairs of the camp proper under the supervision of the SS camp leader.

The supply of food for the prisoners was taken over by the Maschinenfabrik Johannisberg, because it had experiences and connections in this field. The food was prepared in the camp by the women themselves. Neither management had any influence whatsoever on the preparation or the distribution of food. All of the 200 prisoners received the so-called extra allowance for long hours, even those who were only employed within the camp or who were sick, something that actually was contrary to the regulations governing the granting of extra allowances. In addition, especially industrious and handy women received premium slips for which they could buy unrationed food in the camp canteen.

The camp leader, Captain Schaeck who was only detailed to the SS / from the Wehrmacht, used his influence to good purpose, both on his own initiative and the initiative of the managements of both firms in all questions concerning the welfare of the women. It was the Camp Administration exclusively which took care of the sick.

There was, as far as I know, a trained medical attendant and a student of medicine among the SS-men and a trained woman--physician among the prisoners.
