

Defendant Carl Eberhardt, born 23 March 1894, was first engaged by the Krupp firm as of 15 August 1914 but due to war service was only able to take up his duties early in 1933, as an employee in the statistical office. In the early 1920's he was put in charge of the Purchasing Department in the Narrow-Gauge Railroad Department from where he was transferred in 1926 to the Motor Vehicle Plant. He became the head of its Sales Department and held the power of procurist since 1933. Until 1928 his superior was the defendant Pfirsch.

On 1 September 1933 defendant was transferred to the KM (War Material) Department.

In 1937 he was made Office Director, in 1938 Acting Director, and in 1941 Director of the KM Department, of which defendant Pfirsch was in charge until 31 March 1943.

As of 1 April 1943 the Krupp firm was re-organized and all commercial and administrative departments were placed under defendant Janssen.

By and large the latter took over the tasks of defendant Loeser on these matters and the KM Department insofar as defendant Krupp had dealt with it.

Incidental to this reorganization, defendant Eberhardt was made head of the "Machine Construction Sales Office" which came within the orbit of defendant Janssen. He was Deputy Vorstand Member (special field:

Sales Machinery Plants and War Material) (affidavit Janssen, NIK 9322,

Book 1, p.54) and, after Jan. 1944, deputy directorate member (special

field referred to as: machine factories, sales Department) (Doc. ~~XXXX~~ D 137

- A, book 3, p.67/8)

In 1943 a Central Department for Plant Relocations was formed, consisting only of Eberhardt and one assistant and had to lay down guiding principles for solving questions relating to the commercial and organizational fields arising from transfers of plants and departments.

On 1 April 1943 the defendant became deputy Vorstand member.
